## High School Summer Courses

### Credit Recovery

June 13—July 21 Monday—Thursday (No School July 4th)

Classes Held at Whitnall High School

Whitnall Students Only

Fee \$20/Semester Course

If you have failed a course and need to makeup the credit please see your counselor for options. Credit recovery courses are taught thru a combination of direct teacher instruction and web-based software for credit recovery and may be finished in a shorter period of time than the full summer school schedule. **Your registration form student/parent contract should be received from and returned to Guidance.** Three tardies equal an absence and three approved or unapproved absences will be a course failure. You may register for up to two semesters maximum.

This course runs six weeks.

### #H1 High School Painting Grades 9-12

June 13—June 30 Monday—Thursday 10-11:30am

Classes Held at Whitnall High School

Resident Fee \$10

Non-Resident Fee \$75

Students will learn basic painting techniques as well as how to paint landscapes, portraits and other daily objects. Students will be painting from images as well as from real life. They will be furthering their knowledge on the basics of painting as well as how to explore with it even further using different mediums. Smocks or old t-shirts are optional.

## Middle School Summer Courses

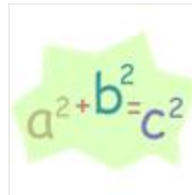
**#M1—Pre-Algebra for Incoming Freshman** (Completion of this course will earn 1/2 High School Credit)

Start High School off Right! Specially designed to help students who would like to be better prepared for Algebra in 9th grade. This course will be taught at the high school using a combination of direct teacher instruction and web-based software. Students will review material at their own pace working on concepts they don't understand and skipping those they have mastered. Three tardies equal an absence and three approved or unapproved absences will be a course failure.

### #E1 Introduction to 5 Year Old Kindergarten

June 13—June 30 Monday—Thursday 8:30-11:30am

Classes Held at Edgerton Elementary School

Resident Fee \$20

Non-Resident Fee \$75

This class is offered to children eligible to attend 5 Year Old Kindergarten in the fall of 2011. Your child must be 5 years of age on or before September 1, 2011 and a birth certificate will be required to register if they are not already enrolled for fall. This class will provide children the experience of a kindergarten environment. Children will experience attending large group activities. Small group activities will include early math and reading skills, art projects and center time. They will learn about taking turns, sharing, following a routine, large and fine motor activities and being responsible for their actions.

### #E2 Transition to 1st Grade

June 13—June 30 Monday—Thursday 8:30-11:30am

Classes Held at Edgerton Elementary School

Resident Fee \$20

Non-Resident Fee \$75

This class is offered to children eligible to attend 1st Grade in the fall of 2011. Children will prepare for 1st grade through an emphasis on reading and writing in workshop formats. EveryDay Math skills will be reinforced using manipulatives, skill builders and games.

The sport of geocaching will be introduced while using GPS technology with walking field trips to nearby parks.

<b>#B2 Summer Band August 8-19 (Monday—Friday) 10:00-11:30am</b> <b>Classes held at Whitnall Middle School</b>	<b>Resident Cost \$20</b> <b>Non Resident Cost \$75</b>
<p>Level: Open to all Band students with a minimum 1 year experience on instrument. (8<sup>th</sup> graders participating in WHS Marching Band may enroll in this course.) Also open to WHS Band students who wish to serve as Music Mentors.</p> <p>Course Goal: Summer Band is designed to maintain and grow students' musical skills and understanding. The group will focus on a community-based performance during the second week of the session and culminate with the Summer Band trip to Six Flags Great America.</p> <p>Attendance Requirement: Students must attend a minimum of 7 class days to perform the Community Concert and participate in the Six Flags trip on the last day of Summer School. Students who are not able to fulfill this requirement are welcome to participate as they are able, but may not attend the trip. Cost of Six Flags trip is approximately \$35 per student.</p>

- COURSES ARE OFFERED DEPENDENT UPON SUFFICIENT ENROLLMENT. Registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis. If more than one section of a class is offered due to high enrollment, you will be contacted for your time preference.
  - Parents/guardians must sign and date the registration form. Incomplete registration forms cannot be accepted.
  - No cash refunds will be given unless a class is changed or cancelled by the Whitnall School District. Any other requests for a refund will be granted at the discretion of the Associate Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction. No refunds will be issued after classes begin.
  - PAYMENT MUST ACCOMPANY REGISTRATION. Make checks payable to Whitnall School District. Registration fee is \$75 per session for non-residents.
  - CHAPTER 220 STUDENTS—All interested Chapter 220 students can attend Milwaukee Public School's program. Call 475-8238 for information. Chapter 220 students are considered non residents and must pay the non resident fee if attending Whitnall's summer school.
  - OPEN ENROLLMENT STUDENTS—All interested open enrollment students are considered non-residents.
  - Tuition assistance is available for students qualified for free and reduced lunch.
  - CLASS SIZE— The minimum number of students for a class to be held is 12 and the maximum number of students is 30.
  - DEADLINE FOR REGISTRATION IS MAY 15. You will receive confirmation in the mail as soon as possible after this date.
