

443.2 STUDENT CONDUCT ON SCHOOL BUSES



Riding the school bus is an extension of the classroom, therefore the School Board shall require students to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with established student behavior standards. A set of behavior guidelines shall be developed by the administration and will be distributed annually to all students.

In cases when a student fails to conduct him/herself properly, such misconduct is to be brought to the attention of the building principal by the teacher or chaperone of the trip, the bus driver, the bus company or its designee. Video recording equipment may be used to monitor student conduct.

Guidelines for proper notification and due process are to be established by the administration. Where continuing or extremely serious problems exist, the bus riding privileges may be denied in accordance with established procedures. In such cases, the parent/guardian of the student becomes responsible for seeing that the student gets to and from school safely and is in regular attendance.

The Whitnall School District shall not discriminate in standards or rules of behavior or disciplinary measures on the basis of sex, race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
