Guidelines & Tips for Enjoying Story Time

Story time is an introduction to the world of books, literature and lifelong learning. Programs may include stories, songs, games, rhymes and other related activities.

Prepare for Story Time

Discuss with your child before you come the importance of being a good listener so everyone can enjoy the stories and activities.

Arrive Early

Allow you and your little one time to hang up your coats and get ready for story time. Story times start promptly at their scheduled time.

Visit the Bathroom

Leave enough time for a trip to the bathroom before story time begins.

Behavior Expectations

We want everyone to enjoy story time! If you need to leave at any time, that is okay and understandable. Feel free to come back and try story time again a different day.

Courtesy to All

Please silence cell phones before story time begins. Nothing ruins a good story like a ringtone, no matter how catchy the tune. Please do not bring food or snacks to story time.

Participation

Your child learns by watching you. It helps everyone (especially your child) if you participate with your child. Talking to other parents during story time tells your child that story time is unimportant or unworthy of your attention.

Story Time at Home

We emphasize literacy in all of our programs, often through playful activities. Children learn through play, so think of this as your 30 minutes a week to pick up fun new activities to try together at home.
