## Survey Section: Pool Planning

We are at a crossroads with our pool.
$>$ It is not regulation size or depth for competitions/hosting events.
$>$ Visitors enter the facility through the girls' and boys' locker rooms, which creates safety and security concerns.
$>$ The pool liner is nearing the end of its service life and could fail at any time. It cannot be replaced again without replacing the entire pool.

Three options have been developed for community consideration. The first two options result in Whitnall no longer having a pool for educational, athletic, or community programming (i.e. swim lessons).

## Pool Planning (cont'd)

Option 1) Remove the pool facility and tear down this section of the building.
Estimated cost: \$2.2 million

Option 2) Remove the pool, fill in the space, and maintain the area for school use (specific options would be determined later).
Estimated cost: \$4 million
Option 3) Update/expand the facility with a regulation-size pool suitable for competitions and create a separate, secure community entrance.

Estimated cost: \$12 million
